De Havilland Vampire
 This was the first De Havilland fighter to have a jet engine. Most people are surprised that Vampire, because of its 'two front legs' (ie. to give them their proper name, tail wheels, although several other aircraft have the feature) is not one of the world's most famous fighter aircraft. Not only flight speed and climb records have been produced, but another version has been used experimentally by the Royal Navy to land on a special rubber deck, making an underwater. A De Havilland Goblin jet engine provides the power for the Vampire.
